## Our Assembly and British Values...

In assembly this week, we learnt about International Day of Democracy and how this links with the British Value of 'Democracy'.

Democracy means 'rule by the people' and is where people elect the government and have a say in how it is run – through voting in elections. Children at Chapel Street learn about democracy in their history and PSHE lessons. We also give them real life experience of democracy by running elections for pupil leadership positions such as School Council and House Captains.
