

Attendance is one of our highest priorities at Chapel Street. Unfortunately, we are currently at 92.5%, which is well below the national average of 96%.
Children who have poor attendance find it much harder to learn to read. This greatly affects their academic performance and results. Did you know that 73 per cent of high school pupils who have over 95 % attendance achieve five or more GCSEs at grades A* to C?

You may not realise it but if your child has 90% attendance, it means that they have missed 9 days of school – that's 50 lessons!

We need your help to improve our attendance and bring your child to school each day!







EYFS News... Reception Assembly


